Auditor General reports on the government's financial statement practices

VICTORIA — Today, in his report, Leading the Way: Adopting Best Practices in Government Financial Statements – 2003/2004, BC Auditor General Wayne Strelioff reports on how the government is leading the way towards having the best summary financial statements in Canada.

Mr. Strelioff explains that his report on the financial statements for the year ended March 31 2004 was qualified, as it has been every year since 1997, because public schools, universities, colleges and hospitals were not included in those statements. But Government has fully adopted generally accepted accounting principles starting April 1 2004, has included these organizations in its financial plans, and will include them in its financial reports for the current fiscal year. "I expect this will be the last year I express this reservation on the financial statements," he says.

In his report Mr. Strelioff continues making recommendations to improve government's financial accounting and reporting, and also encourages the government to provide more information about important decisions affecting the financial statements and about significant transactions reported in the financial statements. As examples, he discusses the changes in estimates that gave rise to significant changes in the equalization revenues recorded, and explains the BC Rail / CN transaction.

"I commend the government for its resolve to build a strong financial planning and reporting framework," said the Auditor General.
