Why We Follow-up

- Not enough for Auditor General to make recommendations and hope they will be acted on
- Follow-up ensures:
 - Recommendations are addressed
 - British Columbians receive full value from our work



Four Forms of Follow-up

Action Plans

Ask agencies to provide action plan within 3 months of report release

Agency Self-Assessments

Self-assessment requested 6-12 months after report released.
Subsequent self-assessments requested if recommendations remain unaddressed

Progress Assessments

Assesses the self-assessment of certain or all recommendations


Progress Audits

Audits the self-assessment of certain or all recommendations



Results of Spring Follow-up

Self-assessments: represent 5 reports, 33 outstanding recommendations, 2 initial follow-ups, 3 subsequent follow-ups





Cumulative Results of Follow-ups

Self-assessments: represent 6 follow-up reports, 35 individual reports, 454 recommendations
